

# Joycelyn Tetteh adjudged Best Female MP

THE National Democratic Congress (NDC) Member of Parliament (MP) for North Dayi in the Volta Region, Joycelyn Tetteh, has been adjudged the Best Female MP for 2023 by the FAKS's Performance of Ministers project.

Ms Tetteh was recognised for her hard work and commitment to her constituents and for continuously embarking on projects geared towards the development of North Dayi.

She was named alongside the New Patriotic Party (NPP) MP for Nsuta- Kwamang- Beposo in the Ashanti Region, Adelaide Ntim.

Others who were recognised

included the NDC MP for North Tongu Constituency, Samuel Okudzeto Ablakwa as one of the Overall Best MPs while the NDC MP for Kintampo North, Joseph Kwame Kumah and the NDC MP for Madina Constituency, Francis Xavier Sosu were named the Best Minority MPs .

## Survey

FAKS's Performance of Ministers project, which is in its 12th edition, assesses the performance of Ministers, Deputy Ministers, and Regional Ministers, MPs and the Chief Executive Officers of the State Owned Enterprises as well as agencies and Regional Coordinating Councils.

It involved projects executed, development in their various sectors, departments, fields, constituencies

and works in Parliament, as well as responses from the constituents who were given the opportunity to share

their opinions as far as the assessment was concerned.

During the period under review, the 16 regions were divided into four zones namely Zone A comprising Greater Accra, Oti, Eastern and Volta region; Zone B regions were Ashanti, Western North, Ahafo and Northern region; Zone C comprise of the Upper East, Upper West, North East and Savannah regions and Zone D made of Central, Western, Bono and Bono East regions.

## Respondents

Zone B recorded the highest respondents, followed by Zone A, D and C.

About 5,063 responses were received across the country. These included groups such as commercial drivers, students, business owners,

traders, journalists, civil society organisations (CSOs) and among others.

Out of the 5,063 feedbacks received, 2,954 of the respondents, representing 58.34 per cent were females while the remaining 2,109 representing 41.61 per cent were

## Males

With age demographics, 68 per cent of the respondents were between the ages of 18 and 55 while the remaining 32 per cent were between the ages of 55 and 78.

In an interview with the Daily Graphic, Ms Joycelyn Tetteh, attributed the feat chalked up to the support from former President, John Dramani Mahama, her colleague MPs and the constituents.

She appealed to Ghanaians to vote massively for the NDC and former President Mahama in the upcoming general election
