In addition to technical skills, the programme will also offer mentoring and basic business management training, ensuring that participants are well-equipped to start and manage their own businesses successfully.

Fairuza Safian, the National Director of CAMFED Ghana, was optimistic about the impact of the

"This partnership will allow us to reach many more women in underserved communities with the skills they need to become self-employed and to employ others within their communities, which will help further reduce the unemployment situation in the country," she said.
